YES. CHAPTER 49 OF THE TEXAS WATER CODE AUTHORIZES A DRAINAGE DISTRICT TO ACQUIRE AND HOLD TITLE TO REAL PROPERTY.

- YES. PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 49 OF THE TEXAS WATER CODE AUTHORIZES A DRAINAGE DISTRICT TO ACQUIRE REAL PROPERTY BY CONDEMNATION.

- NO. CHAPTER 21 OF THE TEXAS PROPERTY CODE SETS FORTH THE PROCESS FOR CONDEMNATION THAT THE DISTRICT FOLLOWS.

- YES. THE DISTRICT HAS THE ABILITY TO ACQUIRE PROPERTY OUTSIDE OF ITS POLITICAL BOUNDARY TO ACCOMPLISH ITS PURPOSES OF PROVIDING DRAINAGE WITHIN ITS POLITICAL BOUNDARIES.

e. Are any of the lands/interests in land required for the project owned by an entity whose property the sponsor cannot condemn? (yes/no)

- YES, ONE TRACT OF LAND NECESSARY FOR THIS PROJECT WAS OWNED BY THE STATE OF TEXAS, BUT THE RIGHTS TO CROSS THIS PROPERTY HAVE ALREADY BEEN OBTAINED.

- Yes, the sponsor will seek training for 6 people prior to the execution of the Project Partnership Agreement.

- No, but the sponsor is in the process of developing the training plan with the assistance of others.

- o We have a Team of 2 Right of Way Agents, 2 Admin Assistants, 3 CAD Techs, 1 GIS Tech. ROW Agents have over 28 years of total right of way acquisition experience. Acquired over 250 parcels

since 2017. Our notable in house projects are from the 2018 Bond Projects that included 37 bond Projects, and our 2023 Bond Projects include 26 bond Projects.

d. Is the sponsor's projected in-house staffing level sufficient considering its other work load, if any, and the project schedule? (yes/no)

- Sponsor has experienced real estate acquisition staffing which is anticipated to be sufficient for acquisition of required real estate in accordance with the project schedule. In the event additional real estate staffing is necessary, sponsor has the ability to add the necessary staffing.

- Yes. Approved Vendor lists are procured regularly for Real Estate Contractor Support, and project specific RFQ can be made in a timely manner. The NFS utilizes retains the services for legal representation to assist with Real Estate Transactions and with Eminent Domain Proceedings.

- Yes but only for training purposes, no assistance is expected to be required in the acquisition of real estate.
